I'd like to thank Senator Russ Huxtable and Representative Pete Schwartzkopf for their support of the Town's grant request for the funding of the new Town Hall, Police Station, and Paramedic Facility. The Town was granted I million dollars in this year's Delaware Bond Bill. Thank you, Pete and Russ! The plans for the new Town Hall, Police Station, and Paramedic Facility have been submitted to the county for review. Once the plans are approved, they will go out for bid.

Safety continues to be our top priority for the Town. With thousands of visitors to Dewey Beach every Summer we are fortunate to have in our Town the Sussex County Paramedics, our Dewey Beach Lifeguards who are all Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) certified, and our police officers. We also have private citizens like Laura Ashby who works with Alex Simchak from <u>Simon's Heart</u> to provide the Town with donated Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). This year Laura donated 7 AEDs to the police for their cruisers, and to the lifeguards. These life-saving devices can make the difference between life and a terrible tragedy in Dewey Beach. Thank you, Laura and Alex!

The crosswalks that were installed by DelDOT in 2019 have provided an easier and more convenient way for pedestrians to cross Coastal Highway. However, pedestrians must use the crossing beacons and check lanes before crossing. See page 3 for more info! We've made a lot of changes to increase pedestrian safety here in Dewey:

- Lowered the speed limit on Coastal Highway to 25mph
- Added additional pedestrian crosswalk markings on the roadway
- Stenciled "look twice before crossing" on the sidewalks at all crosswalk crossings
- Extended a solid white line 50 feet before the crosswalks to prevent vehicles changing lanes
- Installed crosswalk signs on the center island of Coastal Highway, and the north end of Dewey Beach
- The police have conducted speed and crosswalk enforcement throughout town
- Increased the number of streetlights throughout the town with the help of Delmarva Power & Light
- Purchased two radar speed signs and had them stationed at north and south ends of town
- Painted stop sign markings and increased the size of the stop signs at the intersection of Bayard and Cullen
- Extended the 25mph speed zone from Chicago St to Bedford Ave south of Dewey
- Continue to trim the trees on the center island for enhanced visibility
- Requested the state to lower the flashing yellow crossing beacons increase their visibility (proposed this winter/spring 2025)
- Planned the extension of the center island pedestrian barriers from Swedes St, south to Collins Ave (proposed this winter/spring 2025).

# well traveled

tips for getting around safely in Dewey Beach

Crosswalk beacons line Coastal Highway to assist pedestrians in safely crossing the street. Before attempting to cross, hit the button to activate the beacon. Do not assume that because the beacons are lit, traffic will stop! Check all lanes, including the bike lane (scooters and mopeds may be in this lane) before stepping onto the roadway. Do not attempt to cross a lane until it is clear or traffic has come to a stop. Parents should always hold their child's hand when crossing the street.

Our visitors come from all over the world, and not everyone is accustomed to an area like Dewey where distractions are everywhere. Streets are lined with shops and restaurants to see, everyone is searching for parking, many travelers are stressed or rushed, and in between it all are pedestrians, bikes, skateboards, and scooters zipping in and out of town.

It is crucial that everyone, whether traveling on foot or by vehicle, be mindful of the crosswalks, be aware of the crossing beacons, take your time, and pay attention to your surroundings. We love alternative transportation methods here in Dewey! This is why we strive to provide plenty of moped, scooter, and bicycle parking, and encourage use of the <u>DART Beach Bus</u> and <u>Jolly Trolley</u>. Our very own Dewey Beach Police maintain a mountain bike unit, because we know how much easier it is to get around town without a car!

Drivers should be mindful of the bike lane and ensure it is clear prior to making a turn. Be aware that most scooters/mopeds can legally ride in the bike lane as well, and this is common when traffic is heavy.

Many young bike riders are not aware of the dangers of riding the wrong way down the highway. Traffic in Dewey is heavy this time of year, and cars are constantly turning off and on the side streets, not expecting a bicycle to come from the wrong direction. Parents should educate their teens about riding with traffic, and obeying traffic signals just as they would in a car. Ensure your bike is outfitted with reflectors and lights if riding at dusk or nighttime. This time of year, the "nightlife" spans all day long, and therefore, the Dewey Beach Police Department maintains a heavy presence throughout town. We encourage our Dewey family to enjoy themselves responsibly.

During peak times, Uber and Lyft ride prices will spike. Before you decide to drive, remember the cost.

Cost of late-night Uber ride on July 4th from Dewey to Rehoboth: **\$40-\$60** 

Minimum Cost of DUI 1st Offense in Delaware:

- **\$550-\$1,500 fine**, not including court fees and attorney fees.
- Up to 12 months jail time
- 12-24 months license revocation
  Completion of alcohol treatment education program
- \$200 license reinstatement fee
- Risk loss of job, or worse... your life or someone else's.

# LEASH & COLLAR

While dogs aren't required to be on a leash on the beaches in Dewey, it is highly recommended to bring some form of restraint with you. A leash will come in handy if you must remove your dog from a situation quickly! It is also a good idea to keep a collar on your dog with proper identification tags.

WASTE BA95

Waste bags are provided at stations throughout town, including at beach entrances. It's a great idea to bring your own bags, but please take one before entering the beach if needed! Never allow your dog to defecate in the ocean or bay, and always pick up after your dog. <u>Click here</u> for more information.

# DEWEY DOG LICENSE

All dogs in Dewey Beach must have a town dog license. This requirement is separate from a state license, id tag, or rabies tag.

We offer many options for your convenience! Purchase a temporary license for 3 days or 8 days if you're only in town for a brief stay.

If you plan to visit Dewey regularly, purchase a lifetime license. We also offer lifetime limited edition tags with the Dewey Beach town seal!

Dog licenses are <u>available online</u>, at the kiosk outside of Town Hall, or in person at Town Hall during regular business hours.

# Be Ready to Vote This Summer!

### **STEP 1 - REGISTER TO VOTE**

Make sure you're registered to vote by checking the <u>registered voter list</u> posted on the town website. This list is updated periodically. Voter registration is open all year long, closing only during the 30 days prior to the election. If you are already registered, you do not need to register again. Those who wish to register to vote can fill out the voter registration form<u>here</u>. Only individuals who are at least 18 years of age and either bonafide residents, property owners, tenants, or trustees may register to vote. Applicants must meet the criteria outlined in the <u>Town Charter</u>.

### **STEP 2 - MEET THE COUNCIL**

Do you know your local leaders? Read more about the Dewey Beach Town Commissioners <u>here</u>. Our elected officials are devoted individuals with a passion for public service. The best way to get to know your local government officials is to attend or watch the monthly Town Council meetings. View the town meeting calendar on the homepage of our <u>website</u> for upcoming meetings and topics up for discussion. Watch live meetings, or view the archive on our <u>YouTube channel</u>.

### STEP 4 - MEET THE Candidates

Eligible individuals who wish to file as a candidate for the 2024 election should complete the <u>form</u> on our website.

Once filings are received, candidates up for election will be posted on our website. Check back often! Registration continues through August 22nd!

### STEP 3 - STAY IN THE KNOW

Keep an eye on the <u>2024 Election</u> <u>Calendar</u> for important dates! We'll also post election news on our <u>website</u>.

August 22nd: Candidate filing and voter registration deadline.

August 23rd: Notice of Election\*

August 26th: Absentee voting begins! Cast your vote at Town Hall during business hours, or <u>request a ballot by</u> <u>mail.</u>

September 20th: Absentee voting closes at noon.


**September 21st**: Election Day! Cast your vote at the Dewey Beach Lifesaving Station between 10:00am and 6:00pm.

\*Two seats are up for election. If no more than two candidates file, there will be no commissioner election for 2024.


