

TOWN MANAGER'S

After a great Memorial Day Weekend with outstanding weather, June is here and the Summer in Dewey Beach has started. And with the start of summer also comes the start of hurricane season. It's important now that you start preparing for possible impacts of a hurricane and flooding. Please visit PrepareDE.org for important preparedness information. While you enjoy the beautiful weather this week, here are a few summer reminders:

- Fireworks in Dewey Beach will be July 4th at dusk on the north end of the bay. Thank you
 Highway One for once again sponsoring the fireworks show!
- Dewey is very fortunate to have such beautiful ocean and bay beaches. Please keep the beaches clean and remove and throw away all trash in the cans at the dune crossings.
- No smoking, alcohol, or glass on the beach.
- We love our Dewey Dogs, but please pick up after your four-legged buddy. The town supplies doggy bags on each dune crossing, please use them.
- Please respect fellow beachgoers, and keep speaker volume to a minimum while listening to music on the beach.
- No contractor work on Saturdays, Sundays, nor on the following holidays: Independence
 Day Thursday July 4th, and Labor Day Monday September 2nd.

At the north end of Dewey Beach, in the ocean, is a storm water run-off pipe from Silver Lake. During high tides, the pipe and support structure are completely submerged, causing a serious safety hazard. After several meetings with lifeguard Captain Todd Fritchman, I was told 3 people were seriously injured on this submerged structure over the past years. After explaining the situation and safety issue to DNREC, the town obtained permission to post a seasonal "Hazardous - No Swimming" sign to warn the public of the submerged structure. Hopefully this will help keep the public away from the hazard when the lifeguards are off duty.

Do you know a child or teen interested in becoming a lifeguard? The DBP Junior Lifeguard Program is perfect for kids who love the beach, physical activity, helping others, and learning more about our coastal environment.

This fun and educational program is geared towards ages 6 - 16. Participants are provided with instruction from the Dewey Beach Lifeguard Captain, as well as veteran members of the patrol and EMS in lifesaving history, lifequard qualification and training, health, fitness, and safety, the marine environment, water surveillance, rescue equipment, weather hazards, the surf beach, and more!

Upon completion of the program, participants receive official membership in the USLA. Official Dewey Beach Patrol shorts and logo t-shirts are provided. Participants must meet certain criteria outlined on our website. Click here for more information and registration!

Plant Recommendations

Dewey in Bloom volunteers have been busy maintaining gorgeous, sun-loving plants throughout town. Looking to add some of these beauties to your own garden? Check out our recommended plants.

In March, an <u>ordinance</u> was approved to clearly define pervious and impervious building materials. In a flood-prone area like Dewey Beach, it is crucial that pervious materials are used whenever possible to help prevent severe flooding.

In April, the Town Council approved an <u>ordinance</u> to revise penalties for improper removal of trees. This legislation helps to ensure our existing <u>rules</u> regarding tree removal are followed. Protecting Dewey's trees is crucial for our migratory bird population and other wildlife, and also helps to prevent flooding. Learn more <u>here!</u>

Last month, our Charter & Code Review Committee began discussions regarding green space requirements, as well as down spouts and water runoff. TOWN ELECTION

SEPTEMBER 21, 2024

Be Ready to Vote This Summer!

STEP 1 - REGISTER TO VOTE

Make sure you're registered to vote by checking the <u>registered voter list</u> posted on the town website. This list is updated periodically. Voter registration is open all year long, closing only during the 30 days prior to the election. If you are already registered, you do not need to register again. Those who wish to register to vote can fill out the voter registration form <u>here</u>. Only individuals who are at least 18 years of age and either bonafide residents, property owners, tenants, or trustees may register to vote. Applicants must meet the criteria outlined in the <u>Town Charter</u>.

STEP 2 - MEET THE COUNCIL

Do you know your local leaders? Read more about the Dewey Beach Town Commissioners here. Our elected officials are devoted individuals with a passion for public service. The best way to get to know your local government officials is to attend or watch the monthly Town Council meetings. View the town meeting calendar on the homepage of our website for upcoming meetings and topics up for discussion. Watch live meetings, or view the archive on our youTube.channel.

STEP 4 - MEET THE CANDIDATES

Eligible individuals who wish to file as a candidate for the 2024 election should complete the <u>form</u> on our website.

Once filings are received, candidates up for election will be posted on our website. Check back often! Registration continues through August 22nd!

STEP 3 - STAY IN THE KNOW

Keep an eye on the <u>2024 Election</u>
<u>Calendar</u> for important dates! We'll also post election news on our <u>website</u>.

August 22nd: Candidate filing and voter registration deadline.

August 23rd: Notice of Election*

August 26th: Absentee voting begins! Cast your vote at Town Hall during business hours, or <u>request a ballot by mail.</u>

September 20th: Absentee voting closes at noon.

September 21st: Election Day! Cast your vote at the Dewey Beach Lifesaving Station between 10:00am and 6:00pm.

*Two seats are up for election. If no more than two candidates file, there will be no commissioner election for 2024.
