TOWN MANAGER'S / polate

We had a great turn out for our Halloween Trick-or-Treat event in town this year. All of the businesses, the Dewey Beach Business Partnership with their many volunteers, and our own Dewey Beach Police Department did an outstanding job making Dewey Beach a great place to be for all of our little trick-or-treaters and those who are young at heart! Thank you to all!

Now for some updates on town projects:

- DelDOT's Dewey Beach Public Safety Project on RT 1 will begin the week of December 2nd and finish sometime in March of 2025. This project includes improving and replacing sidewalks as needed, updating and moving signage where necessary, continuing the "Dewey Wave" from Saulsbury Street to Clayton Street, and Read Avenue to Collins Avenue, updating crosswalk markings, and lowering the yellow beacons at crosswalks.
- DelDOT has postponed the street paying project until the Fall of 2025.
- After a year of working with Representative Schwartzkopf and the Secretary of State's Office, DNREC, and DelDOT, the Dewey Beach Lifesaving Station located at 1 Dagsworthy Avenue has been turned over to the Town from the state. I will be working with the state to get the location designated and marked as a historical location. Thank you Representative Schwartzkopf for all of your assistance to make this happen!
- The <u>Burn Ban</u> issued by the State Fire Marshal's Office is still in effect for Dewey Beach.
- The Town applied for and received \$53,000 in Community Transportation Funds (CTF) supported by Senator Huxtable and Representative Schwartzkopf for storm drain projects on the first and second block of Jersey Street. I expect this project to start this winter.

Lastly, we have quite a few holidays during the month of November. Town administrative offices will be closed on the following days:

- November 28th & 29th Thanksgiving

Charter & Code Review Committee

Since 1981, many hard-working committee members and commissioners worked together to create legislation to benefit Dewey Beach. As you can imagine, certain needs of the town are bound to change over time. This group of volunteers assesses all aspects of the charter and code, and makes recommendations to our Town Council on legislation that may need to be updated or improved to best serve residents, visitors, and business owners.



Climate Change Committee

The purpose of the Climate Change Committee is to make recommendations to the Town Council regarding likely climate change impacts in Dewey Beach and ways to adapt to and mitigate these impacts. This committee does the hard work of researching climate change issues that directly affect the Delaware coastal community.



Finance Committees

Our Audit and Finance Committees are committed to protecting and improving the financial health of the town. Many members bring years of accounting, banking, or investment expertise to the table. With public safety being paramount, maintenance and waste management, beach patrol, and police presence are nonnegotiable necessities. However, these services come at a hefty cost! Our Finance Committee assists the Town Council in exploring the best options to cover these expenses.

Dear Dewey Beach Resident,

The Dewey in Bloom project kicked off in the Spring of 2024, with the goal of beautifying Dewey Beach with colorful flowers and plants. Thanks to generous donations, we were able to place 28 "bloom boxes" down the Route 1 corridor, brimming with beautiful flowers. We continued our mission for Fall 2024, and just recently placed cold weather-tolerant plants to last throughout autumn into early winter. We strive to keep Dewey Beach blooming as long as possible, for all to enjoy!

Many residents have asked how to get a bloom box installed on their street. We'd be glad to help you in this endeavor! Many of our planters throughout town are sponsored and maintained by groups of neighbors.

Step 1: Spread the word! Ask your neighbors to join you in raising money to sponsor a bloom box on your street. The total cost for a new sponsorship for 2025 is \$750.
Step 2: Recruit your team! Bloom boxes require weekly watering over the summer, and some pruning/maintenance. We recommend a team of at least 2 neighbors to plant and care for your bloom box. Planting takes place twice a year, once in the spring, and again in the fall.
Step 3: Enjoy! Being part of a club, fostering community connections, and spending time gardening are all great for our wellbeing, and directly benefits our town.

Let's Talk Trash

Our current residential trash contract expires in the spring of 2025. Town staff begins the work now to assess the needs of our residents and homeowners, and decide if changes need to be made in the collection process of waste and recycling. We want to hear your thoughts! But first, in order to move forward, it's important to understand how far we've come.

This topic will be discussed at the next Town Council meeting on November 15th!



Trash & Recycling Committee

In 2016, the Trash & Recycling Committee was formed to tackle trash problems in town. There were a number of concerns:

- Residents had the choice of securing their own trash provider. While this was great to have the freedom to price shop, it had many drawbacks. Streets became overrun with different trash collection companies, driving around 24/7, all on different schedules. It was noisy, congested, and created excessive wear and tear on our streets.
- Without proper oversight, some residents decided not to pay for trash collection, and instead disposed of household waste in public trash cans. This resulted in many overfilled cans on street corners, and trash blowing around town.
- There was no mandatory valet service for rental properties. Cans were left in the public right-of-way by tenants for extended periods of time, overfilling with trash.

In the end, the committee recommended to the Town Council to enter a contract with a single-source vendor for residential properties (only one company would serve the town for residential trash and recycling). This vendor would provide cans for each property. Property owners who rented their home were required to secure valet service - this would prevent cans being left in the right-of-way, or not being put out for collection. These changes greatly improved the issues related to trash.



Where Are We Now?

In 2016, the bidding process for a single-source trash and recycling vendor yielded only one applicant. While the company has been bought out numerous times, we've continued with the original service contract.

Considerations...

- Current pricing is as follows:
 - In Season (twice/week trash collection, once/week recycling collection): \$31/mo basic; \$47.12/mo valet
 - Off Season (once/week trash collection, biweekly recycling collection): \$26.57/mo basic; \$37.31/mo valet
- From the start of the contract in 2017 to 2024, homeowners have experienced a price increase of less than \$1 per year.
- Property owners may opt to cancel service temporarily when their home is not occupied.
- Arguably, Dewey Beach trash collection is not a sought-after contract. The amount of valet service, narrow, crowded/busy streets, and traffic congestion makes collection exceptionally difficult.
- In order to lower pricing, changes will likely need to be made. For instance, this could include fixed, yearly pricing for all properties, with no option to "opt out."


